Good afternoon,

I spoke with Janice this morning, and she stated you have signed one of the forms needed for submission of our Virginia Juvenile Community Crime Control Act (VJCCCA) plan due this week. Thanks for getting that done so quickly. When I emailed that form to you on Friday, I forgot to send the Resolution (copy is attached) for your Board of Supervisor's review.

As you know and as a reminder for your Board, our CSU is in the process of completing our Plan for FY2017 and FY2018. The Code of Virginia states that to participate in VJCCCA a locality "shall biennially submit to the State Board for approval a local plan for the development, implementation and operation of such services, programs and facilities..." (§ 16.1-309.3(D)) funded through the VJCCCA.

Our plan is a "Combined Plan" as defined below (from the VJCCCA Manual):

"Localities that wish to operate VJCCCA programs jointly with one or more other localities shall submit only one plan and one set of reports. Localities must choose the same fiscal agent and the same plan and data contacts.

A combined plan, reflecting all participating localities, shall include:

- A resolution from each governing body that states their intent to join with the other listed governing bodies and which designates one of them as the fiscal agent
- A Participation Compliance Certification Form from each chief administrative officer."

The attached Resolution is required to come from the governing body of each participating locality, endorsing participation in the VJCCCA. For localities that wish to operate VJCCCA programs jointly with one or more other localities (combined plans), the resolution should name the localities participating in the plan and designate one locality as the fiscal agent. Our plan includes funds from the State of Virginia that are designated for Accomack County (\$23,933.00) and for Northampton County (\$12,336.00). Accomack County will act as the fiscal agent.

I will be stopping in tomorrow afternoon and can apprise you of our plan going forward for FY17&18. Once the Resolution has been approved by your Board, I can come back down to pick up the signed copy by you.

As always, I appreciate your time and participation in our VJCCCA plan. See you tomorrow.

RESOLUTION

Be it further resolved that the Accomack County Administrator is hereby authorized to execute a local plan on behalf of the County of Accomack.
