Spencer,

As I mentioned to you on the phone today. I think the 55 mph speed limit in front of my Nursery's Lumber Hall Farm is too dangerous. It used to be that all of Bayside Road was 45 mph. Somehow we have become 55 mph for less than a mile right in front of my office at Lumber Hall. We have had a numerous small accidents in the last couple of years. And, as a result, we have worked to take our traffic off of Bayside Road. However, we still have a significant amount of traffic around Lumber Hall.

Normally, about 110 employees enter and exit from the Bayside Road. The highway entrance is too dangerous. Besides employees entering and exiting, we take in deliveries daily and have multiple over the road tractor trailers exiting each day. As you have seen yourself, our Agricultural tractor traffic is substantial. Additionally folks are constantly walking and biking this road in large numbers. In order for all of us to be safe in all of Hadlock, I truly believe the road in front of the Nursery should be a 35 mph like it is in the rest of Hadlock.

I hope we can do something that will be good for us all. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to call me.

Again, thanks for the help with this important safety issue.
