Dear Mr. & Mrs. Morris,

Thank you for submitting a list of questions at the Public Information Session held at the Cheriton Fire House on September 16, 2013. Below are answers to your questions:

A) I would like to know why my questions that are questions that were submitted on August 20, 2013 to the PSA in Eastville, VA were not made a part of the minutes of the meeting.

Answer: The submitted questions are referenced on page 2 of the minutes of the August 20, 2013 meeting. The questions, along with the PSA responses, are on file in the County Administration Office.

B) I understand that the "Special Tax District" or landowners will be charged as per the following: The County has funded 25% and they expect the "Special Tax District" to pay 75% of the costs to pay for the installation of the sewer line.

Answer: That is the proposal under consideration by the Board of Supervisors.

C) Is it true that my property tax will go up from .67 cents per 100 to \$2.19 per hundred dollars. If so, this is a 75% increase in my property taxes.

Answer: No. If the Special Tax District is approved, it is estimated that taxes will increase from \$0.67 to \$1.19 per hundred dollars.

Question: Is this legal?

Answer: Yes.

D) Mr. Robert Panek: In the questions that I handed you at the August 20, 2013. Your reply to me is NO. Cape Charles is not making any moves at this time to extend their boundaries. But did you not at a recent Cape Charles Board Meeting mention about extending the Town of Cape Charles boundaries out to Route 13.

Answer: This question is not within the purview of the PSA and should be addressed to the Town of Cape Charles.

E) I would like to know who authorized the sewer line survey in this area and who is paying for this?

Answer: The survey performed by Hurt & Proffitt was authorized by the PSA to develop information to better inform the Board of Supervisors as they consider the proposed service area. It is being paid for by the funds appropriated by the Board of Supervisors for PSA engineering services.
